Take advantage of all the opportunities that may comey our way to gain new skills and retool yourselves for the future. The future belongs to those who adapt the fastest to changes. I wish you lives of long-term achievement and fulfilment as you make a positive contribution in the communities that you will interact with hereafter. My address will not be complete without taking cognisance of the fact that there is an ongoing process of recruiting a Vice Chancellor. I wish to recognize our staff and students and respective unions and union leadership for your patience and for giving this recruitment process a chance. I wish to also thank you for trusting the institutions rightfully vested with the process. Faced with many reasons to be complicit, I am glad that you have deliberately chosen the high road and given the invitation to complicity a cold shoulder. I appeal to you in these late days, to continue being upstanding members of our community. Just as you depend on this university, your university depends on you too! Let us all subordinate ourselves to the greater good of the University.
